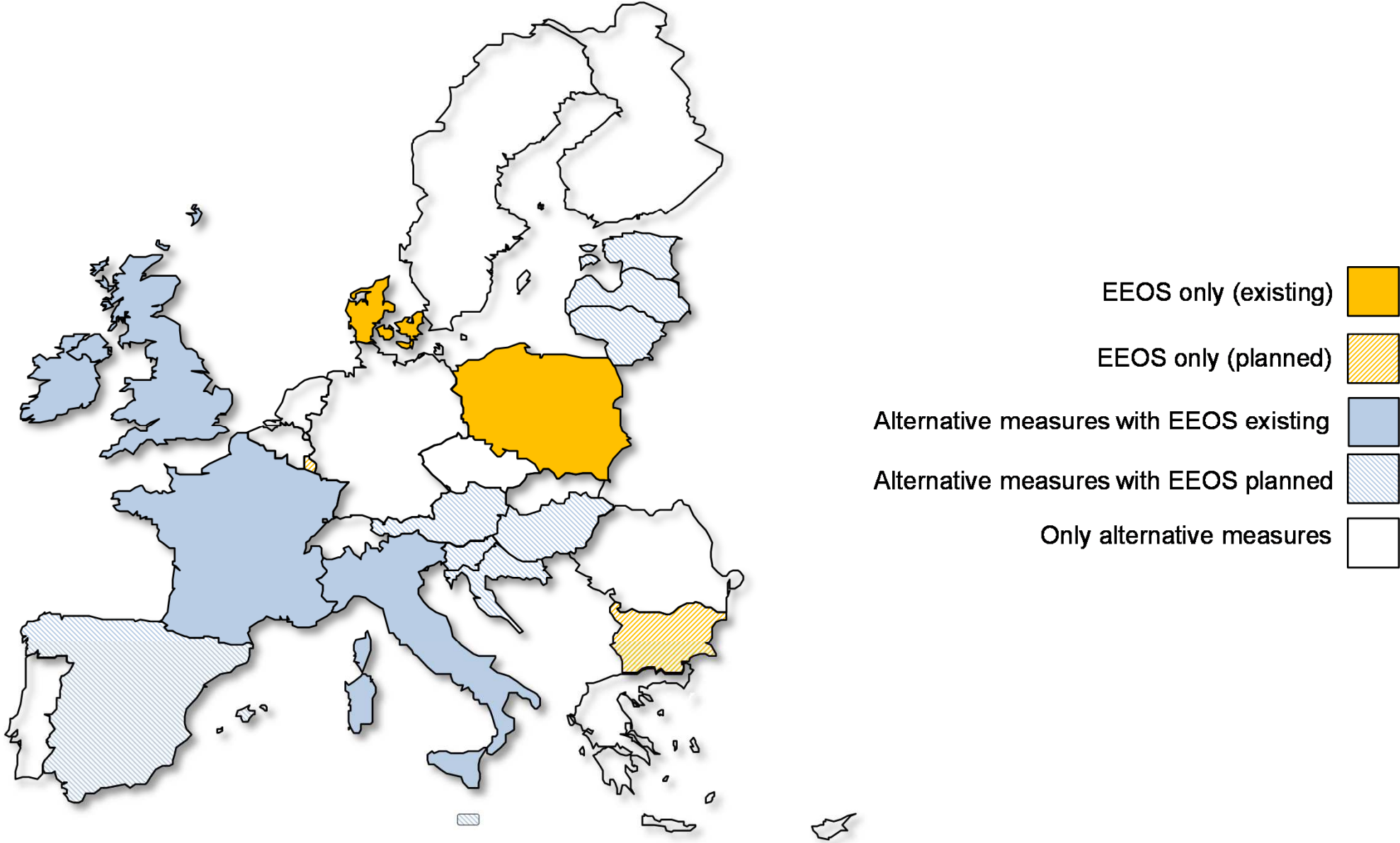

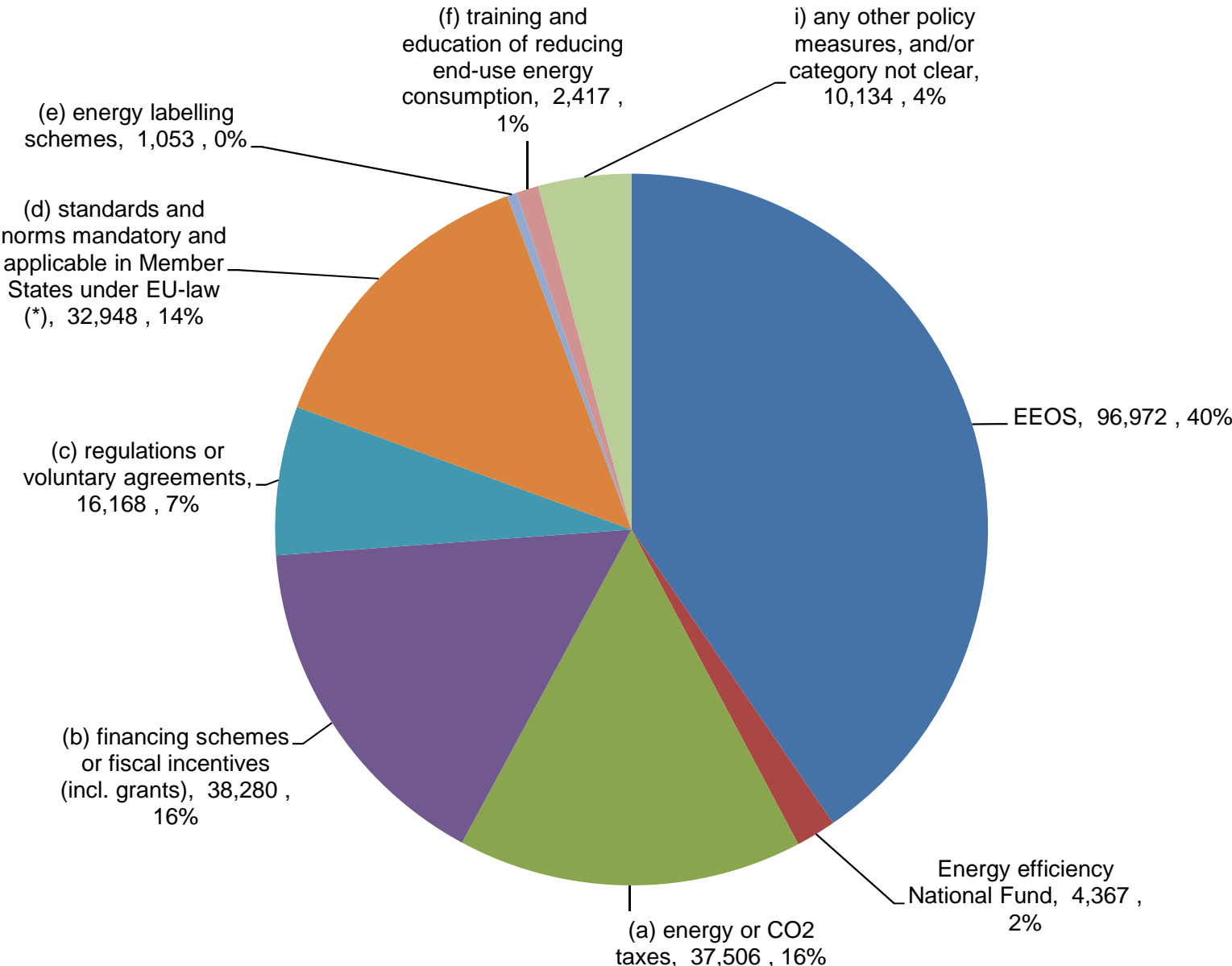

EEOS planned in 11 Member States in addition to 6 existing notified EEOS



EEOS are supposed to deliver 40% of the savings



- **Sectors:** all sectors or not specified
- **Targets:** not clearly specified yet for most new EEOS
- **Banking and borrowing:** no provisions in any of the EEOS
- **Penalty regime:** Only Austria specifies penalties, 3 MS (Hungary, Latvia, Spain) mention penalties but do not specify the level of penalty, the other 13 MS do not mention penalties yet

- **Trading:** only Austria (bilateral trading) and Spain (bilateral, not clear whether also vertical trading)
- **Requirements with social aim:** only introduced by Austria (uplift by factor of 1.5 for savings achieved in fuel poor households)
- **Obligated parties:** 4 MS put the obligation on energy suppliers (Bulgaria, Luxembourg, Slovenia, Spain), 1 MS on distribution companies (Lithuania) and 2 MS (Estonia, Malta) on both distribution companies and suppliers

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
